

Washington, DC author Arsalan Iftikhar presents his second book â " his first ISLAMIC PACIFISM: Global Muslims in the Post Osama Era published in 2011. Now pesents a most timely new book â " SCAPEGOATS: How Islamophobia Helps Our Enemies and Threatens Our Freedoms. Arsalan is an international human rights lawyer who according to NPRs Michael Martin has â 'become a go-to voice in American media, playing a variety of rolesâ "explaining Islam, decrying Islamic extremism and also what he sees as rising islamophobia.â ™ Arsalan is also the founder of TheMuslimGuy.com, senior editor of The Islamic Monthly, and has spoken on the major media outlets. In his Introduction he states, â As I was preparing to submit my first draft of this book to my publisher, I began to hear breaking news about the November 2015 terrorist attacks in Paris, which ultimately claimed 130 innocent lives. For the next week, I spent all my time running between TV and radio studios here in Washington, D.C., doing interviews with Anderson Cooper on CNN, Chuck Todd and fellow panelist Tom Brokaw on NBCâ ™s Meet the Press, on ABC News Nightline and National Public Radio, as well as on overseas networks like Al-Jazeera English (twice in three days) and CCTV, the largest English-language television news network in China. That was just in one week alone. Then, just as I was finishing my revisions on the book, news broke about the December 2015 mass shooting in San Bernardino, California, where a husband and wife Muslim couple named Syed Rizwan Farook and Tashfeen Malik murdered fourteen people in cold blood during a holiday party for the San Bernardino County health department where the husband worked.

I purchased this book because I was interested in obtaining another viewpoint concerning one of the prominent issues of today. I had hoped to read something thought-provoking, but instead I was greatly disappointed. Hereâ TMs why: In the Foreword, Arsalan Iftikharâ TMs friend, Reza Aslan, states â œâ |more Americans will die because of â faulty furnitureâ TM than at the hands of Islamic terrorists.â • No argument here, as 1% of 1% of 320 million Americans is 32,000 people, so while this statement is true, it is a misuse of facts to ridicule the concern that Americans have about Islamic terrorists. Unfortunately, this device is used throughout the book, and I found myself using the Internet to fact-check many of the statements as well as recorded television conversations.For instance, Mr. Iftikhar talks about a discussion between Bill Maher and Fareed Zakaria, stating that in the end, Maher â œâ |could only childishly snap that he found his guestâ TMs criticism â însulting.â TM â • This presents an entirely different view of the conversation, especially when Zakariaâ TMs quotes are moved around by the author. In the middle of the conversation, Zakaria said â œYou're not persuading people with what you're doing. You're getting applause lines in the

West.â • Maher responded, â œYou know what? That's insulting, that I'm doing this for applause linesâ • (this was the second time Zakaria had made the applause lines accusation). Zakaria returned to his point, â œWell, I'm telling you that the reality is you're not changing those people.â • (Zakaria had been stating that if change was what Maher wanted, â œâ |then what you have to do is push for reform, but also with some sense of respect for what the spiritual values that people thinkâ •).It is unfortunate that Mr.
