

My boyfriend and I got this to take on our first trip into the boundary waters. Great stories and we found out we even ended up camping at the same site that the writer and his family did on one occasions. Really fun to read while in the boundary waters but would be good anywhere.

The terrific combination of the author's talents as a writer and writing instuctor, coupled with his

years of experience canoeing the Boundary Waters, makes this a marvelous read. Whether you have been to this wilderness paradise or only dream of doing it before you are too old to hoist a canoe on your shoulders, this book will introduce you to the zen of paddle and portage. As you read Wilber's descriptions of the BWCA stillness, you can hear the loon's call shatter the silence in your imagination.

A valuable book for at least chronicling some basic history of the Arrowhead Region in general. The personal story between father and son was poignant. I've had a similar experience with my father. He first took me into the BWCAW in 1965 and I was privileged to take him on a Boundary Waters trip for his 75th birthday. We also used Sawbill as a regular entry point for the early years, and I came to have a personal connection with the Hansen family through a mutual friend. Reading this book evokes so many memories: the song of the loon, the intense beauty and quietude of the wilderness, and the smell of popcorn burning over the campfire.Steve's story is at once a geological and political history of the Boundary Waters and a compilation of charming stories of many trips with friends and family members. Filled with photographs from these trips, the book brings the reader an appreciation of the people as well as the environment he loves so well.

I like a memoir that tells a good tale. Wilbers does just that. His writing is excellent, and he keeps up pulled in with his stories of canoeing with his father and other friends. I, too, in my youth canoed the Boundary Waters reularly, and reading this book gave me great pleasure. There are also several photographs. You'll love this book if you a fan of the BWCA.
