

This book has quite a few things going for it. It has humor and if you're into pop SciFi (Star Trek, Dr Who, films and books of that genre), you'll get most of the references. The story itself is too straightforward, but the writing is good and easy to read and with a constant pace. Took me few days to read and thoroughly enjoyed it. It's written almost with a movie script in mind. Would make a funny movie.

First I would rate this a 3.5 stars I sorta liked it. The book kind of reads like an Abbott and Costello routine especially in the first chapter. The back and forth banter between characters are always talking in a circular argument that can get a little tiring after a while however that's what makes the book different from other stories. There are a lot of references to pop culture especially to Star Trek and being a Trekkie I found that funny. There is a point in the story where Morgan is trying to find out why he is needed for the team, and he says "Well then, what part of the team am I? Like the Red shirt or something?" Too funny. Anyway, the best way for me to describe this book is like a mash up of Dr. Who and Monty Python.
