

I love the parade of people who have come to visit so far and the sometimes awkward, sometimes painful, sometimes funny ways that families and friends speak their minds as they attempt to communicate in an unfamiliar situation, especially when they hope Marigold is listening, but arenâ TMt really sure. I love books with lots of dialogue and in this case the â œconversationâ • happens between the doctors, nurses, visitors and the thoughts in Marigoldâ TMs head as she struggles to regain consciousness before someone pulls the plug. I canâ TMt wait to see who will show up next. I still plan to follow the serial on Stephanie Bond's website, but lâ TMm also buying the Kindle version so I can re-read the complete story all in one sitting at the end of the month.

A middle child, she is used to being overlooked, but this time she is in centre stage and in spite of her perilous position, actually enjoying some aspects of it. There are many "laugh out loud" moments in this story, and to my utmost surprise, I am eagerly awaiting Part 2.:)
